Reflecting on this past year, our commitment to building stability, expanding opportunity, and strengthening community has guided every step forward. Through our partnership with the Catawba Area Coalition for the Homeless (CACH), we helped more than fifty households move from homelessness into safe, stable housing. Each placement reflects the power of collaboration and the impact we can make when we work together.

We also completed our Owner-Occupied Rehabilitation waitlist, ensuring that long-standing repair needs for homeowners were addressed with care and urgency. These repairs preserve homes, restore dignity, and allow residents to remain safely in the communities they love. In addition, we expanded our Disaster Assistance Program to better support families recovering from storm damage and unexpected hardship.

This year also marked the start of our hands-on partnership with York Technical College's Building Construction Trades Program, giving students real-world experience while helping us build and preserve affordable housing for our community. Partnerships like this demonstrate how education, service, and housing can work together to strengthen the future of Rock Hill. Thank you for your continued support and commitment.

FIRST TIME HOMEBUYER PROGRAM

HDC empowers first-time home buyers with valuable resources and up to \$5,000 in home-buying assistance. Participants can attend in-person classes every quarter, covering essential topics like credit, budgeting, financing, and navigating real estate transactions. This support comes in the form of a second mortgage, with 20% forgiven each year over five years—an incredible opportunity to invest in your future. To qualify, buyers need to complete the educational course, meet income and credit criteria, and purchase within Rock Hill, setting them on the path to success.

INDIVIDUAL DEVELOPMENT ACCOUNTS

HDC received funding from United Way of York County and Family Trust Federal Credit Union to create the Individual Development Account (IDA) Program, a financial stability initiative for low- to moderate-income households. Participants meet monthly with a financial counselor, complete financial education, and receive training related to their savings goal. Eligible goals include homeownership, transportation, education, or computer/software purchases, and graduates receive \$5,000 toward their chosen asset. Family Trust Federal Credit Union serves as our financial institution partner, providing tailored accounts and counseling for each participant.

AGING IN PLACE



With support from the AARP Community Challenge Grant, HDC expanded its ability to help older adult homeowners safely age in place by providing accessibility accessories such as grab bars, safety rails, and improved lighting. With help from summer volunteers and partner organizations, we installed these upgrades directly in residents' homes. This work strengthens our commitment to creating safe, accessible, and affordable housing for people of all ages.

TREE REMOVAL

With support from the One SC Fund, we are removing storm-damaged trees and hazardous debris in Southside Rock Hill to improve safety and restore livable conditions for low-to-moderate income homeowners. This funding fills a critical gap by covering damage other disaster-recovery programs could not address, helping residents return to safe, accessible homes and strengthening neighborhood resilience.

WINDOW UNITS



With support from the York County Community Foundation's Care & Comfort Grant, HDC is providing window air-conditioning units to low-income seniors living without safe indoor temperatures. By delivering and installing these units at no cost, we help older residents stay safely in their homes during extreme heat and improve overall quality of life across Rock Hill.

OWNER-OCCUPIED REHABILITATION

Through this program, HDC provides assistance to city of Rock Hill homeowners that earn at or below 80% of the area median income to correct Housing Quality Standards (HQS) violations/repairs to that threaten the health and safety of the occupant.

Eligible activities: roof repairs/replacements, HVAC repairs/replacements, handicap accessibility projects, new windows (if sills are broken or irreparable), and buried potable waterline or wastewater lines.

SOUTHSIDE HOME IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Through this program, HDC provides assistance to city of Rock Hill homeowners in Wards 1 and 5 that earn at or below 80% of the area median income.

Eligible activities: Storm damage, roof repairs/replacements, windows, and siding.

REBUILD SOUTHSIDE

On April 20, 2024, around 4 PM, a powerful hailstorm struck Rock Hill with relentless 90 mph winds and softball-sized hail. The storm brought widespread devastation, toppling trees, demolishing roofs, and shattering windows. To date, the Housing Development Corporation, in collaboration with the City of Rock Hill, construction companies, community donors, and many others have been working together to repair our community.

RENTAL PROPERTIES

HDC has built its rental housing stock primarily through grant funding, donations, and strategic acquisition. Most homes are set aside for those at or below 30%, 50%, 60%, 80%, or 120% of the area median income. This year HDC served the most rental clients in its history. We are working to develop more affordable housing stock in the city of Rock Hill.

DUPLEX ADDITIONS

The City of Rock Hill sold the property at 405 W. Main to the Housing Development Corporation for \$1. In partnership with Family Trust Federal Credit Union, HDC received a grant from the Federal Home Loan Bank of Atlanta's Affordable Housing Program to develop two duplexes at 403 and 405 W. Main. This year, we opened all four two-bedroom units, which are reserved for low- and moderate-income households experiencing homelessness and identified through our partner agencies. HDC also received a grant from The Good Folks of York County and Springs Close Foundation to help furnish the units with essential items.

RAPID REHOUSING AND RAPID RESET

Rapid ReHousing helps individuals and families move quickly from homelessness into safe, stable housing by providing short-term rental assistance and case management tailored to each household's needs. In partnership with the Catawba Area Coalition for the Homeless (CACH), HDC expanded this program significantly over the past year, serving more people than in any previous year of our program's history. This growth reflects increased capacity and the strength of community partnerships—service providers, shelters, faith-based organizations, and local leaders—that make this work possible. Together, we continue to make homelessness rare, brief, and non-recurring.
